Singing of carols, dance, games, food, lucky draw, etc., were part of the celebrations.

The Staff Christmas Get together was held on 22nd December 2023. There was Carols, Games, lucky draw organized for all our staffs. The boundless joy of meeting everyone together was visible on the faces of all the staffs. Christmas gifts were presented to the staff which was followed by fellowship.













LEARNING FROM OUR HISTORY

George Williams, the founder of the YMCA movement was a farm boy who was sent to the town of Bridgewater as a draper's apprentice. Here George went through a spiritual experience. In 1837, at 16 years of age, he knelt down at the back of the shop and gave his heart to God. He took as his life's motto, "It is not how little but how much we can do for others." He became an earnest, prayerful Christian. In 1841, he shifted to London to work in Hitchcock and Rogers, a wholesale commercial firm of drapers. Here he lived above the warehouse with 139 other apprentice boys. George Williams and another young man were the only two in the group who met for Bible study and prayer for an hour every evening. The number gradually grew and on 6th June 1844, twelve prayerful young men belonging to different denominations, met and decided to form the Young Men's Christian Association. Two other names suggested were: "The Draper's Evangelical Society" and "Christian Young Men's Association". They were, however, dropped because the first would restrict it to the drapers' trade and the other to men of Christian religion. From its birth, inspired by the spirit of ecumenism and reconciliation, the YMCA became a Christian organisation open to all. George Williams relied on personal contact, praying and studying the Bible together with others. He was attempting to build a youth organisation that focussed on spiritual growth. He was not a theorist but believed in the practical religion of deeds rather than words. Like the Master, he went about doing good. He had great faith in tea and seed cake. He emphasised the value of the cup of cold water. On one occasion, advising a fellow worker George Williams said: "When a young man proves difficult to reach do not argue, take him to supper" - he showed thus his profound knowledge of human nature.

George Williams married the daughter of the owner of the Company where he worked and succeeded as its proprietor when the owner died in 1863. The experience and success he gained both in his business and in his spiritual life helped him to guide the destiny of the YMCA movement in London as its President until he died in 1905. He proved that it was possible to be both an earnest Christian worker and a successful man of business. His farewell message at Paris in 1905 was, "Young men, give your hearts to God whilst you are young."

Through this camp the students got an opportunity to come together and experience the place and various activities which escalated their bond and developed solidarity among the students.



Motivated and Enriched Latent 2023

On 10th December 2023, Bombay YMCA Student Branch organised Latent, a leadership development seminar at YMCA International House. Starting with the lighting of the lamp by our esteemed guest speakers, along with Mr. Leonard Salins (General Secretary) and Mr. Michael Raj (Branch Chairman), the event accelerated with a positive spirit. The sessions were started by Ms. Chhavi Gaur and Ms. Aastha Puri, who elaborated on the importance of communication as a means to progress various career paths, along with spiritual communication and individuality.



The Students got an insight into YMCA Vision and Mission through the Chief Guest, Mr. Michael Raj, Chairman, Student Branch, who also spoke on aspects of being a YMCA Volunteer, followed by an interactive and engaging session by Ms. Sharon Anna which de-stigmatised the discourse around the mental well-being that is of utmost importance in modern times, especially in young adults. We then were treated to a session by Adv. C.J. Joveson about understanding the functions of law and realising that every law, even the punishing ones are made to protect citizens from exploitation and that law should come from within. The students were then met with a presentation conducted by Mr. Joseph George, who spoke on How to be Financially Independent as a Student or Intern.

This was followed by a Panel Discussion with panelists Adv C.J. Joveson, Mr. Joseph George, Ms. Sonia Mascarenhas and Mr Reyansh Vanigota, who detailed the journey to transition from student life (academicia) to a working professional vis-à-vis Finance, Skills, Environment, Mental health, Competition, and Gender biases delving into its various aspects. The panelists gave real-life examples of their experiences and it was effectively moderated by an in-house student, Mr. Rishav Rastogi of the YMCA.

The day-long seminar ended on the note of students going home highly motivated and enriched.

Winners in each of the four categories: Short, Medium, Tall, and Super Tall, in the Budding & Open sections were awarded medals and certificates, enhancing the recognition of their exceptional achievements, from the Chief Guest, Mr. Michael Manuel Raj, Board Member, Bombay YMCA, and Associate General Secretary, Mr. Austin Kunder.

Highlighting the historical significance of the Bombay YMCA Best Physique Contest, Mr. Sunil Lobo, President. Bombay YMCA. emphasised organisation's commitment to empowering communities for almost 148 years. Congratulating Mr. Krishna Pujari, the Mr. YMCA (Open) winner, Mr. Lobo noted the enduring popularity of the D.P. Melville Rolling Trophy, instituted in 1969, and its status as the most sought-after Body Building Competition.

The contest first held in the year 1969 has rich legacy, as its past Title winners, like Mr. Raymond D'Souza, who went on to win the Mr. India title five times, and Mr. Ashish Sakarkar, who won the Mr. India title four times and the Mr. Universe Silver & Bronze medals, is also a recipient of Maharashtra's prestigious sports award, the Shiv Chhatrapati Award.

Additionally, Manmohan Londhe won the Gold medal in 40+ Table Tennis Singles category and a Silver medal along with Manoj Khatri in the doubles category.

Open State Level Athletic Meet 2023

The 46th Bombay YMCA Open State Level Athletic Meet was held from 16th to 19th November 2023, at the University Pavillion. We received 3627 entries and the total participants were 2412. In all, 76 Schools, 18 Colleges and 68 Clubs took part in the 128 events. Participants from Sholapur, Satara, Sangli, Nasik, Palghar, Panvel, Ambernath, Dombivali, Mumbai Suburbs and Mumbai City took part.



Restarting Home Swim Gala after COVID 19 Swimming Pool, Procter Branch

Home Swim Gala was conducted successfully on 29th October 2023 at the Procter Branch Swimming Pool. 330 entries were received for the 27 events. After COVID 19, this was the first Home Swim Gala. Two Technical Officials were invited and 46 volunteers, coaches and staff, as a team, conducted the gala.





The Chief Guest, Olympian Joaquim Carvalho, gave away all the trophies to the champions. Board Members and Committee Members along with the President, Mr. Sunil Lobo, and the Chairman were present for the Finals and Prize distribution. The standard of the athletes was excellent. More than 100 Officials, Malis and Volunteers worked day in and day out for the success of the meet. Several Meet records were broken this year.

Responding to Homelessness

Shelter for Underprivileged Youth World Homeless Day was observed on 10th October 2023 at our Center. The purpose of World Homeless Day is to draw attention to homeless people's needs locally and provide opportunities for the community to get involved in responding to homelessness.

The Special Guest for the programme was Mrs. Vibha Jadhav, DAY-NLUM night shelter project head of Mumbai district, and the BMC K West Ward CDO. They had a brief discussion on World Homeless Day with the youngsters at our Centre. A special lunch was sponsored by well-wishers.

A Talent Competition was organised for Balwadi children on 21st October 2023 at the Bombay YMCA Khar Danda Centre. The children of all the batches, i.e., Nursery, Junior KG and Senior KG, performed dance, sang songs and filled the atmosphere with excitement. The Children also dressed up for the Fancy Dress Competition.

The Chief Guest was Mr. Sunil Lobo, President Bombay YMCA, who gave prizes to the winners along with the Committee Members of Bombay YMCA Khar Danda Centre. The Parents of the Balwadi children were very much happy to see their children performing.



VTC collaboration with MKCL

Bombay YMCA organised an Independence Day Quiz for schools with MKCL's support. This collaboration enhanced the event's success and fostered a positive community spirit.

Teachers Training Programme

It has been a wonderful experience for the teachers and supervisors. We are gaining valuable knowledge from the trainer, and all our Balwadi teachers visited the Muktangan Balwadi, initiating improvements in all our Balwadis.





FUN AND RECREATIONAL EVENINGS



SENIOR CITIZEN MEETING

This is a new initiative for the senior citizens of the Borivali locality, who meet once a month, for a time of fun and recreation. The first meeting was held on 22nd September 2023, where 22 individuals attended, playing a game of housie.



The second meeting was held on 27th October 2023, where approximately 55 senior citizens participated. This time it went on from 6 to 8 pm. The third meeting was held on 17th November 2023. Group Games, a brief awareness audio video session by a team of doctors on Cancer Prevention from HCG Apex Cancer Hospital at IC Colony was part of the programme. 65 senior citizens and 10 volunteers participated.



Women volunteers from the Church at IC Colony have agreed to help in this initiative on a long term basis. The response is getting better and the feedback is encouraging.



SEEKING RECOVERY FROM ALCOHOL ADDICTION

Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) meetings are held every Monday and Wednesday at the Navi Mumbai branch, providing a supportive environment for individuals struggling with alcohol addiction.

The AA meetings have been consistently well-attended, indicating a strong interest and dedication among individuals seeking recovery from alcohol addiction. The diverse group of attendees reflects the inclusive nature of AA, where people from various backgrounds come together to share their experiences and support one another on the path to sobriety.

AA meetings often follow a structured format, including the sharing of personal stories, discussions of the Twelve Steps, and reflections on the principles of the AA programme. The supportive atmosphere encourages participants to open up about their struggles and successes, fostering a sense of camaraderie and understanding.



Programmes for Enriching children

Diwali Party for Balwadi Students

On the 2nd and 3rd of November 2023, all the Balwadis celebrated a Diwali party with the children. Sweets were distributed to the children, and the teachers explained the significance of the Diwali festival.

Additionally, the teachers engaged with the students, asking them about their personal Diwali celebrations at home with their families.



Motivation Session for VTCE Students by Art Scape

Art Scape organised a Personality Development program for VTCE students on 8th December 2023, focusing on motivational and inspirational talks to impart knowledge about life skills. Three sessions have been conducted successfully.



Olympiad Exams for Scholar Students from BMC and Private Schools

Fifty government and non-government schools were approached for the Olympiad exams at an event held on 12th December 2023, organised by MKCL and Bombay YMCA ORD Department, thus giving a big platform to scholar students.

We spoke to the Headmasters of these schools and provided information about the exams. 150 students, who are very good in their studies, have enrolled for the Olympiad Exam under the YMCA.



AIDS Prevention and Awareness in the Community

The Bombay YMCA Outreach and Development Department organized a rally for AIDS prevention and awareness in community areas on 1st December 2023. The rally commenced from the ORD department, passing through Agripada market, Madhapura, Mumbai Central, Kamatipura, and concluded at the ORD office. The event involved 150 participants, including Balwadis teachers, helpers, VTCE students, teachers, and volunteers who walked and distributed pamphlets on AIDS awareness. In Kamatipura, a street play on AIDS was performed by a youth group, featuring a skit along with songs.

On the 2nd of December, another street play was organised on Grant Road and Falkland Road to raise awareness about AIDS. Following the street play, teachers and staff distributed pamphlets on HIV awareness.



The President of Bombay YMCA, Mr. Sunil Lobo welcomed the gathering, and the President of YWCA of Bombay, Ms. Blessy Babychan read out the message of the Presidents of World YMCA and YWCA. Rev. Thomas Jacob spoke on the theme and emphasised the importance of cultivate hope and love, to strengthen the bonds that can create a safe space and environment where every seed can grow and blossom. YMCA Y Voices and youth delegates from CVJM Stuttgart presented a special number. The Choir of the Church sang hymns which uplifted our soul.

On 17th November 2023, we visited Purnata, an NGO that works with Commercial Sex Workers and their children, Youth and Transgender.



The Closing Celebration Service was held at YWCA, Fort on 18th November 2023. Dr. Sybil Thomas, the Guest Speaker, encouraged those gathered to plant the seeds of positive change today, so that future generations may enjoy the fruits of our labour and bring change in the society.

Vacation Bible School

Over 200 children, in the age group of 6 to 18 years old, were blessed through Vacation Bible Schools (VBS) held at three of the YMCA branches during their Diwali vacations. The theme was "Serve one another" (Galatians 5.13).

The VBS at the Navi Mumbai branch was held from 14th to 19th November 2023, where an average of 94 children gathered. Children benefited from the valuable life lessons through creative activities and sessions from the Bible. The theme successfully emerged though the VBS, as the Teachers and Volunteers played a crucial role in reaching out to the children and sowing the seeds of faith. The students too sincerely engaged themselves in all the activities and participated in Sing Songs, Creative Arts, Memory Verses and Quiz Competition.

At the Borivali Centre, the VBS was held from 8th to 10th November 2023. For the first time it was held at the ground under the shed. Young volunteers and teachers, led by Pastor Isaac A., from Kandivli helped in the programme. 65 children benefited from the VBS.



The Youth group of the Rahator Memorial Methodist Telugu Church started the day off with a soultouching praise and worship. Guest speakers, Ms. Vanita Tiwade and Rev. Avinash Rangayya, gave them a deeper understanding of Christian teachings, values, and principles.

Rev. Christopher Karkada and volunteers conducted team building activities, providing opportunities for participants to connect with others. The goal was to make a positive impact on the lives of the Christian youth, empowering and nurturing the faith.









At YMCA Andheri, VBS was organised for the Boys Home Children from 8th to 10th November 2023. The VBS featured devotional songs, games, and stories. Pas. Santosh Humbre and Sis. Sharon Solomon, and Pas. Baiju Salve and his wife taught the children from God's Word, based on the theme. On the 3rd day, a thanksgiving programme with Bible recitations, new songs, and a skit was presented. Certificates were distributed by Ms. Olive, acknowledging donations from Pas. 


DEEPENING THEIR UNDERSTANDING OF BIBLICAL PRINCIPLES
